There are over 4,300 families in Ontario with a child in cancer treatment or follow-up care each year.

While a cancer diagnosis comes as a shock at any age, when a patient is young, it seems incomprehensibly unfair. Childhood cancer comes with a whole world of disruption for the entire family—physical, emotional, financial, psychological, educational and vocational. It is a world of which few of us are fully aware, unless we have to enter it ourselves

POGO Satellite Clinics bring patient care closer to home in communities across Ontario.

POGO Interlink Nurses provide excellent nursing support to the young cancer patient and help families identify useful resources and services in the community, including the POGO Financial Assistance Program.

The POGO Financial Assistance Program* provides much-needed financial support to families for food while they are at the hospital, childcare for siblings at home and accommodation when they need to travel for treatment.

POGO AfterCare Clinics across Ontario monitor survivors regularly for long-term effects from cancer treatment.

POGO School and Work Transitions Counsellors* help survivors get the support and assistance they need to finish high school and move on to post-secondary education or work.

POGO research* translates into improved care and better outcomes.

POGO's continuing education* activities provide a wide range of opportunities for healthcare professionals to enhance their knowledge and advance their practice in order to improve childhood cancer care.
